Rather than listing every tune I play I have listed some of the tunes I play for weddings, and as well as some typical titles of different tune types. A demo CD is available with many of these tunes on it for you to listen to and make choices for the various parts of your wedding or event. Please do not hesitate to ask if you have a request that is not listed here, for it is quite possible I may know it. Most of the tunes can be played on either the Highland pipes or on the Scottish smallpipes. If a tune is listed as Border pipes only, the range goes beyond the scope of the Highland pipes or the smallpipes.

Scottish Smallpipes, a bellows-blown instrument, are quieter and mellower in tone than the Highland pipes. They can be appropriate for quiet, contemplative parts of a wedding such as a candle-lighting ceremony. I have smallpipes in the keys of A, D, and C, and each one has it's own distinctive sound.
